of motorcycle riders from Southern Arizona and several neighboring states, made it possible to donate \$1,700 to each of the two selected organizations.

The Thunder Mountain Chapter said it was thankful for "all participants in the Memorial Run and all the volunteers who worked hard to make the run a great success."

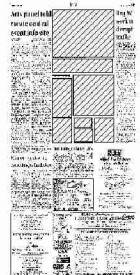

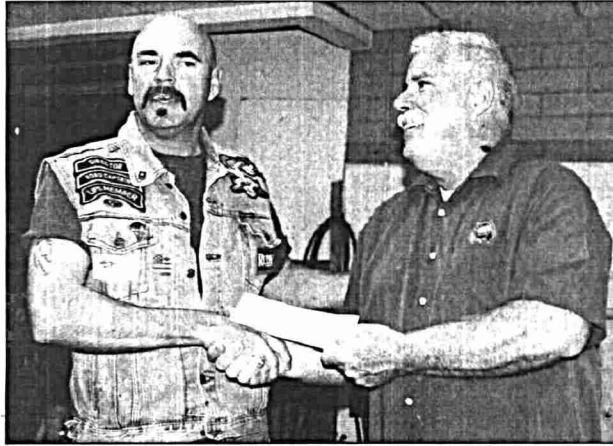
